Tiger Scout and his Akela

- The Tiger program requires parents to attend with their son (no drop offs). When a Tiger registers, the parent is also registering and will be listed on our Pack Charter as a Tiger Adult.
- Tiger dens operate under the "Shared Leadership" model where each parent takes a few turns running a meeting or organizing an activity. For example, 18 meetings between Sept and June = 3 den meetings per family, assuming 6 families in the den
- Each den need parents within each den to volunteer as den leader or assistant den leader. OR two Co-Leaders. Batman had Robin. The den leader needs an assistant too :)
- Cubmaster to run the first den meeting (or two or three) to model how to run a den meeting and to make sure the dens get off to a strong start.
- We will also discuss the dens and how to structure the boys into dens of six to eight boys each. We can work together to create the groups.
- Tiger dens can do joint activities together, but from a coordination standpoint (getting RSVPs, planning outings, etc.) it's easier for the Den Leader and Assistant Den Leader to work with six families versus up to 12.
- The den leaders and assistants can then coordinate together across the two dens.
- Siblings can attend if babysitting not available.
